01 Human Genius in the Age of AI

FLAGSHIP KEYNOTE

For philosophy of AI, digital humanism and interdisciplinary conferences.

As artificial intelligence becomes part of thinking, creating and deciding, what does it mean to remain the author of a meaningful human life? This talk introduces Genialism™ and examines the relationship between human genius, self-knowledge and responsible action. It asks how AI can support or displace our participation in forming purposes, and what we need to cultivate in ourselves as artificial assistance grows.

DISCUSSION POINTS · human genius and contribution; authorship of purposes; evaluating the role of AI in human agency.

02 Original Human Agency

For AI ethics, philosophy of technology and university seminars.

A person can approve a decision without having shaped its purpose, its framing or its reasons. This talk examines substantive human authorship across the process of action and the difference between augmented and derivative agency. It explores authorship through purpose, judgement, revision and responsibility, and the conditions for meaningful human-AI collaboration.

DISCUSSION POINTS · final approval versus participation; authorship and responsibility; conditions for human-AI collaboration.

03 Inquire Within

For public philosophy, education and human development events.

How do we recognise a direction as our own? Drawing on Genialism™, this conversation explores intellectual, emotional, intuitive and bodily dimensions of self-knowledge, and how inner inquiry becomes meaningful commitment and action.

DISCUSSION POINTS · four dimensions of self-understanding; inner conviction, reflection and evidence; self-knowledge and meaningful contribution.
